### War and Peace

Considered one of the greatest works of the legendary writer, Lev Nikolayevich Tolstoy, this enthralling epic depicts the invasion of Russia by Napoleon, who hijacked the French Revolution and betrayed its principles, with his seemingly invincible French Army. The impact on the lives of those caught up in the conflict is chronicled through the stories of over five hundred characters, among whom many are historical. The story follows the rise and fall of aristocratic families in Russia who are linked by their personal and political relationships. Tolstoy's philosophy is illustrated through the idealistic and impulsive Count Pierre Bezukhov, who persists on the path for absolute truth, and the unpredictable Prince Andrei, who shifts from utilitarianism to cynicism. Ensnared in the paradoxes of birth and death, free will and fate, the characters interweave with a variety of individuals from lower class to royal families and lead lives of imperfection and grandeur.

Generally thought to be one of the greatest novels ever written, it remarkably displays Tolstoy's cold analytical scrutiny, which is usually attributed to the province of historians rather than to that of the novelists. It may be even mildly surprising for some to find the great writer supposes political changes and even the pervasive and incessant deaths as inevitable and natural as succession of seasons.

### The Unlikely Spy

As one of the decisive steps to final victory, the Allied decided to land somewhere in western Europe and advance into Germany, destroying any forces arrayed against the invaders in order to force the surrender of the Nazi regime. As the Allied invasion was not far away, the high command desperately needed to know where it would take place. A tale of spies and betrayal during the Second World War by one of the bestselling American authors, Daniel Silva, features, how Catherine Blake, one of the last German spies in Britain, a sleeper planted before the war and awaiting orders, attempts to gain access to the D-day plan; on the Allied side, British intelligence also has its orders. The academic Alfred Vicary has

been recruited by Churchill himself to carry them out. It is his job to find Catherine and stop her before it is too late. Blake's demise is clearly spelled out by history; however, Vicary's success is not as clearly defined as Blake's failure. It is an intriguing thriller on espionage and Double Cross for those who crave the mysteries in secret service.

### Origin

As one of the most controversial writers, Dan Brown introduces us a brash futurist and computer prodigy, Edmond Kirsch, who comes up with a theory so bold, so daring that, as he modestly thinks to himself in Brown's beloved italics, 'It will not shake

your foundations. It will shatter them.' Based on the questions raised by scientists who adopt atheism in a world where strict creationism has less and less relevance, the religion-flouting and shocking ideas may throw our entire belief systems into

jeopardy. Accompanied by the beautiful and brilliant fiancée of the future King of Spain, the renowned and beloved Harvard symbologist professor, Robert Langdon, chases all over Spain on Kirsch's trail in order to unravel the final episode of Kirsch's astonishing breakthrough as it teeters on the brink of being lost forever.

As in his previous works, Brown has his story revolve around real monuments and landmarks in Spain, making it a sensible choice to learn about the Catholic traditions in Spain. Enigmatic symbols, gunshots, extreme religion and hidden history all together make the book an entertaining thriller.

### The Death Instinct

The second work by Jed Rubenfeld, a professor at Yale law school, based on the psychoanalytical theories of Dr. Sigmund Freud, begins with the true and shocking bombing in America's financial centre in lower Manhattan in September 1920, in which four hundred people were killed or injured. Though the purpose of the attack has never been unveiled to this day, the appalling event has long been believed a terrorist attack in America's history.

The gripping novel weaves among war veteran Dr. Stratham Younger, his friend Captain James Littlemore of the New York Police Department and the beautiful Colette Rousseau, a French radiochemist. The secret trail leads them away from New York on to a psychological journey from Vienna to Prague and finally to Paris, where the most incomprehensible and savage instinct of human beings reveals itself at last. As the seemingly disjointed pieces of what Younger and Littlemore learn come together, the two uncover the shocking truth behind the bombing.

With experience in both Shakespearean Plays and the help of his thesis on Sigmund Freud, the writer delivers an enthrallingly concocted fiction which demonstrates how political conspiracy and corporate crime concern us all.

### Sophie's World

Looking in her mailbox one day, a fourteen-year-old Norwegian schoolgirl called Sophie Amundsen finds two surprising pieces of paper. On them are written the questions: 'Who are you?' and 'Where does the world come from?' Together with the writer, the enigmatic Alberto Knox, Sophie embarks on an extraordinary tour through the history of Western philosophy from the pre-Socratics to Sartre. In the wild, incredible and sometimes bizarre introduction into the world of philosophy, Sophie not only learns about the eccentric ideas of early philosophers but also starts to open up her enquiring mind to the fundamental questions that philosophers have been asking since the dawn of civilization.

The remarkable book was originally written in Norwegian by Jostein Gaarder, having been translated into over 59 languages, and over 40 million copies have been sold worldwide. Gaarder

## **Bad Blood: Secrets and Lies** in a Silicon Valley Startup

Being the first to break the story, John Carreyrou, the prize-winning journalist, reports in detail the full inside story of the breathtaking rise and shocking collapse of a multibillion-dollar startup.

Theranos was a massively hyped "unicorn" healthcare startup that aimed to perform hundreds of blood tests from a single drop of blood pricked from your finger. The founder and CEO of Theranos, Elizabeth Holmes, was once widely seen as the female Steve Jobs: a brilliant Stanford dropout whose startup "unicorn" promised to revolutionize the medical industry with her machine that was claimed to be able to make hundreds of complex blood

tests significantly faster and easier than traditional blood testing system. In a decade, under the support of famous capital investment ventures such as Larry Ellison and Tim Draper, Theranos managed to raise \$900 million at a peak valuation of \$9 billion, putting Holmes's worth at an estimated \$4.7 billion. Everything seemed to be on the right track except for one problem: the technology did not work.

Though exposed to the pressure and threats from Theranos lawyers, Carreyrou together with the whistleblowers successfully unveiled the fact that Holmes had been misleading investors, FDA officials, and her own employees. A criminal investigation is underway, and indictments are likely. The detailed account of the upsetting corporate fraud cautions against the bold promises and gold-rush frenzy of Silicon Valley.

### Nothing to Envy: Ordinary Lives in North Korea

Tourists who have actually visited North Korea can tell that it is hardly possible to know the ordinary lives of people living there as they are only allowed to visit the showcase capital Pyongyang and talk to the carefully selected citizens living there. To explore this enigmatic country,

one has no other ways other than interviewing those who managed to escape from the country, widely known as the defectors. Based on her interviews with over 100 defectors, the writer Los Angeles Times journalist Barbara Demick presents to her readers facts about North Korea in an informative and telling journalistic style. The book also provides keen insight into the personal experiences, attitudes and views about events, such as the famine of the 1990s — in which more than a million people might have died.

One of the most impressive chapters depicts how Dr. Kim, a once ardent loyalist to North Korean socialism, experienced a stark revelation upon escaping to China in order to avoid impending starvation at the sight that dogs in China were fed with rice, a luxury only available to the officials of high ranks in her country. 'She still wanted to believe that her country was the best place in the world. ...But now she couldn't deny what was staring her plainly in the face: dogs in China ate better than doctors in North Korea.'—Nothing to Envy, ~ p. 220

Published posthumously, Persuasion is the last novel of the influential British writer Jane Austen. It is unfortunate that Persuasion is often overshadowed by its seemingly more glamorous siblings, Sense and Sensibility and Pride and Prejudice. This has been helped by the big-name cast BBC adaptation, with Colin Firth as the cold and distant Mr Darcy and Ang Lee's Oscar winning adaptation, with Alan Rickman as the chivalrous Colonel Brandon. The story concerns Anne Elliot, a young Englishwoman of 27 years, whose family is moving to lower their expenses and get out of debt. Their tenant's brother in law, Captain Frederic Wentworth, proposed to Anne earlier but Anne refused him due to his

social status. Now they meet again, both single and unattached, after no contact in more than seven years.

Jane Austen once compared her writing to painting on a little bit of ivory as the plot concerns many trivialities of family life faced by young women of her times. One must say it is an enormous success on her 2 inches square. Since the characters' lovely traits and annoying habits are painted so vividly, many readers of all time believe they are actual people. Subtle and sarcastic, Jane Austen never disappoints her readers.



### The Minds of Billy Milligan

It is widely accepted as a brilliant work depicting the very first man who used multiple personality disorder, a highly controversial psychological condition, in an insanity defence.

Appearing to be a weird young man, Billy Milligan was in effect suffering from dissociative identity disorder, under which, 24 different personalities competed to 'take the spot to control his body' in the physical world. His personalities ranged from a deaf young boy aged 4 to a well-educated young Englishman aged 22, who was interested in hematology, while the real Billy was put to sleep since high school.

These distinct personalities battled for supremacy over Billy's body for over 10 years to act as they liked without the knowledge of other personalities until the police broke into Billy's house one day and had him arrested for kidnapping, robbing and raping three women. In a landmark trial, Billy was acquitted of his crimes by reason of insanity caused by multiple personality—the first such court decision in history—bringing to public light the most heartrending case of multiple personality ever recorded. During the psychiatric treatment Billy was ordered to receive, he was confirmed to be having 24 personalities, including men, women and several children, each showing unimaginable traits, living as a family in his mind. This book will lead you to an extraordinary trip into the mind of this tortured man and his splintered world.

### Mr. Tony is Full of Baloney!


